Minister to groom:

Please repeat after me:

In the Spirit of love and unity, I, <u>GROOM'S NAME</u>, marry you, <u>BRIDE'S NAME</u>, merging my life and its purpose with yours and shall endeavor to love and honor you as I do my true self.

Minister to bride:

Please repeat after me:

In the Spirit of love and unity, I, <u>BRIDE'S NAME</u>, marry you, <u>GROOM'S NAME</u>, merging my life and its purpose with yours and shall endeavor to love and honor you as I do my true self.

Ring Exchange:

Minister to both:

What token to you give to each other in love? (Minister holds the rings and says)

These rings are a symbol of unity – two hearts as one – and of mutual respect and love for one another.

Minister to bride:

As such, will you place it upon his finger and repeat after me. (Minister hands ring to bride and she places ring on third finger of left hand of groom)

"Let this ring, ever be the symbol of our love. As a token of our devotion, I place it upon your hand."

Minister to groom: Repeat after me.

"As a token of our devotion, I give it place upon my hand."

Repeat process with second ring for bride.
